








THE Jehovah's Witnesses teach that the 144,000 are the only people to have a future heavenly hope, leaving all other JWs members of the Great Crowd who will possess the earth after the battle of Armageddon.

In the Watchtower of February 1st, 1982 it informs its members: "the heavenly hope was held out, highlighted and stressed until about the year 1935. Then as 'light flashed up' to reveal clearly the identity of the 'great crowd' of Revelation 7:9, the emphasis began to be placed on the earthly hope."

But what does scripture say? Where is the Great Crowd according to God's Word?



Looking at verse 9 of Revelation 7 it says:

"After this I looked and there before me was a Great Multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and in front of the Lamb."

The Great Crowd are said according to this scripture to be standing before the throne and in front of the Lamb.

In Revelation 5.6 we read of the Lamb standing in the centre of the throne. Looking at Revelation 7.9 we see the Great Crowd standing before the throne and in front of the Lamb.

From these scriptures we can see that the Great Crowd and the Lamb are very close together, verse 11 continues "and (please notice little words like and - they indicate a continuation of the same description) all the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God."

Now either the angels, elders, and four living creatures and the throne of God are on earth with the Great Crowd or, more reasonably the Great Crowd is in HEAVEN where the angels, elders, four living creatures and the throne of God are located.

Let us not debate this ourselves, let us look and see what the Bible says. Turn to Revelation 7:13 and read to the end of the chapter. Verse 15 says they are before the throne of God (the Great Crowd) they serve him day and night in his temple, and he who sits on the throne will spread his tent over them.

The Bible tells us in Revelation 13:5 the Beast was given a mouth to utter proud words, and then goes on to tell us in verse 6:

"He opened his mouth to blaspheme God, and to slander his name and his DWELLING PLACE (Tabernacle or Temple) and those who live in Heaven."

So we have learnt that the temple is in Heaven and the Great Crowd are in the temple. So the Great Crowd must be in Heaven.

To conclude this matter read Revelation 19:1 which says:

"After this I heard what sounded like the roar of a Great Multitude in Heaven shouting."

So, where is the Great Crowd?

The answer can only be in Heaven, in the temple before the throne.

The fact is this - the Watchtower's theory of two classes of believers is a lie. In Romans 3:22 we learn that God's righteousness is through faith in Jesus - for all who believe. There is no distinction.

Yet the Watchtower teaches a another gospel - a gospel of partiality.

Don't let the Watchtower deceive you! You can be assured of your salvation and know that you have eternal life if you will receive Jesus as your Lord and Saviour.

THE TESTIMONY OF MARGARET BARKER PART ONE

happily Woman married at 30. the age of Margaret Barker Was person who enjoyed life fully. She did not smoke. about things. could cope with any situation although she had a quiet fear of death. person who got on with people, she did not anyone to help her with her life, she could manage by herself. This is her story.

In 1983, for the first time in my life, a situation arose that I could not cope with. My husband Trevor became a Christian. The only thing I could see was that his brother was taking him away from me and drawing him into a religion. I did not want anything to do with it.

CHANGE

In October of the same year I noticed a real change in Trevor's life - he was not losing his temper anymore. This was great, but he began reading the Bible, listening to Christian tapes, putting stickers in our car (Jesus is King!). The most

upsetting thing was that he intended taking our two boys, Wayne aged nine and Glyn aged five, to church with him. I was so upset because I loved them so much and I felt that they were being taken away from me.

At this point I would like to say that I had never attempted to read the Bible, but things began to happen to me that were, as I discovered later, like things written about in the Bible.

INVITATION

On Friday, December 2, Trevor invited me to go with him to a 'Power and Praise' meeting at a Methodist Church. I totally refused, but suddenly I changed my mind. It was as though someone was drawing me to the meeting. It was at this point that the Father began drawing me to Jesus, (John 6:44). I went the following night and I really enjoyed it, I came home quite joyful. Afterwards,

Trevor asked me if I would ask Jesus to come into my life. The answer was no, I would never do that because I did not feel a need for Jesus.

LIFELESS

On Sunday morning i went with Trevor's sister to her local church to find out what Trevor had gotten himself into. The meeting seemed so dull and lifeless, but halfway through the service the Vicar said let us pray. Everyone was quiet and for the first time in my life I prayed. My prayer was not for myself, but for my mother, as she had been ill for three All I said was: "Will you months make my mum well and happy?" I could not address God as Father. hecause I did not know personally. After Church I walked to my mum's home and as I did I felt quite joyful again. When I arrived, my mum was really ill. I could not understand why I continued to feel so happy, when my mum was so ill.

On Tuesday I went shopping with Mum. I got the shock of my life! She was really well, and said: "These are the best two days I've had in three months." At this point I began to believe a little more, but thought after a while, it was only a coincidence. I did not tell Trevor anything at this time.

WE DON'T IDENTIFY OR DO WE?

JUST who are the writers of the Watchtower magazine? Humbly the publication does not carry the names of those

who contribute to its pages. Or do they?

In the Watchtower of December 1, 1993 we are told of first president Charles Taze Russell's humbleness. In the article on page 18 it says. "In keeping with this principle, we can take as a modern-day example the first president of the Watch Tower Bible and Tract Society, Charles Taze Russell, whose faith we may imitate. Was he a humble man? Indeed he was! As has been well observed, in the text of his Studies in the Scriptures, six volumes of some 3,000 pages, not once did he make a reference to himself."

The article continues by saying: The publications of the Watch Tower Bible and Tract Society today follow this principle in not drawing attention to men by identifying

the writers of the articles."

But just a few paragraphs later the Watchtower is breaking its own rule when it states: The fourth president of the Society, Fred W.Franz, was also a fine example of humility. As vice president of the Society for some 32 years, he did much of the writing for the magazines and for the convention FEE programmes.

We have all seen how the Watchtower changes its teachings from one edition to another. Now it seems it is contradicting itself in the same article.
